Fowler Store · Post Office

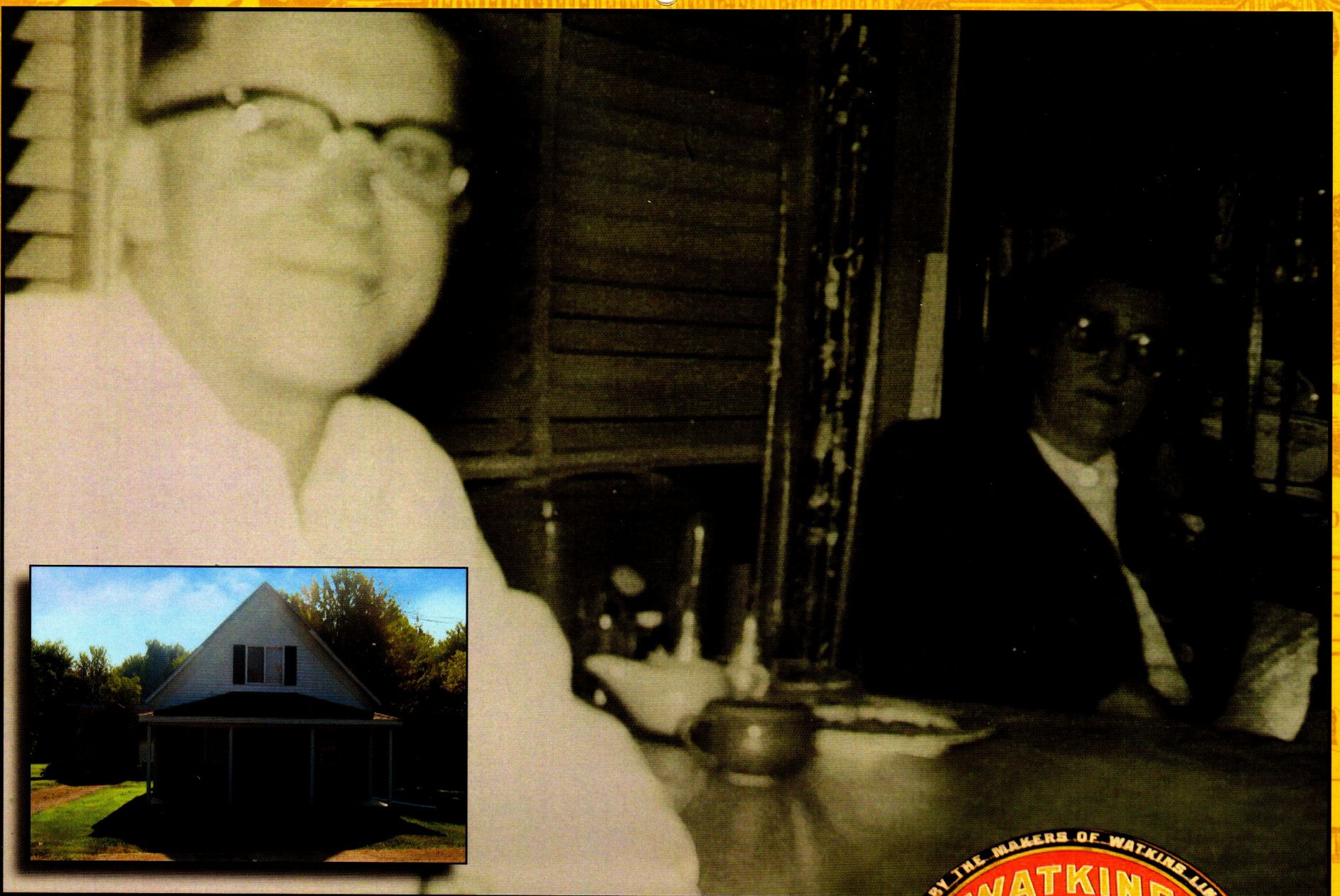
Guy Fowler was Post Master of Goodells for 36 years (1912-1948), his store serving as Post Office and general store for the surrounding community. Guy's dog was known to trot down to the railroad station daily to pick up the mail bags from the train. Guy's daughter Marion acted as his assistant for many years. The property was sold to Jim Nolan Jr. who donated many artifacts including postal records, business log book, original front door and counter to the Wales Historical Society before the structure was restored as a home.

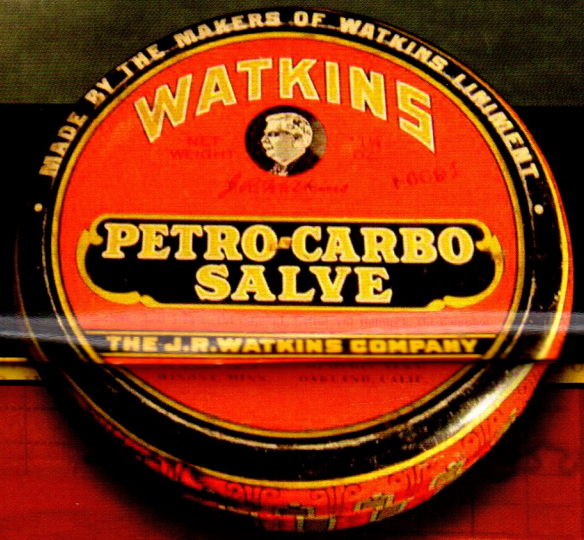

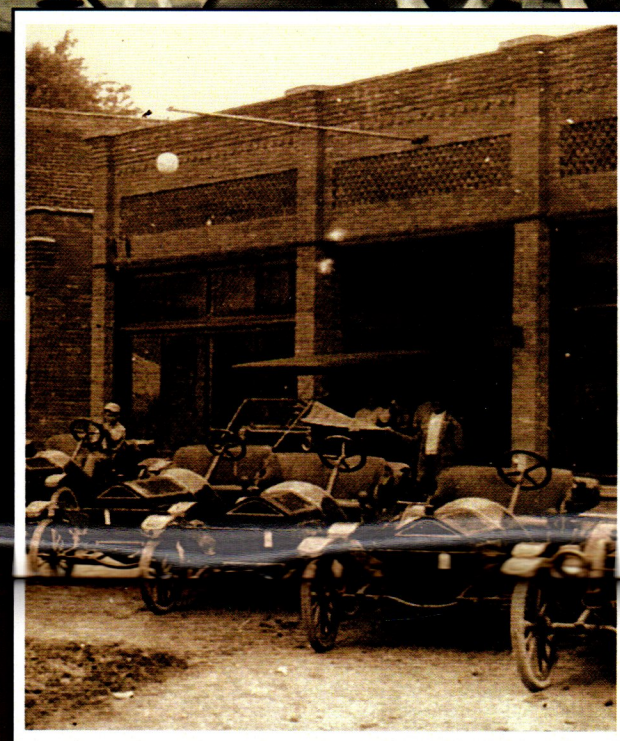
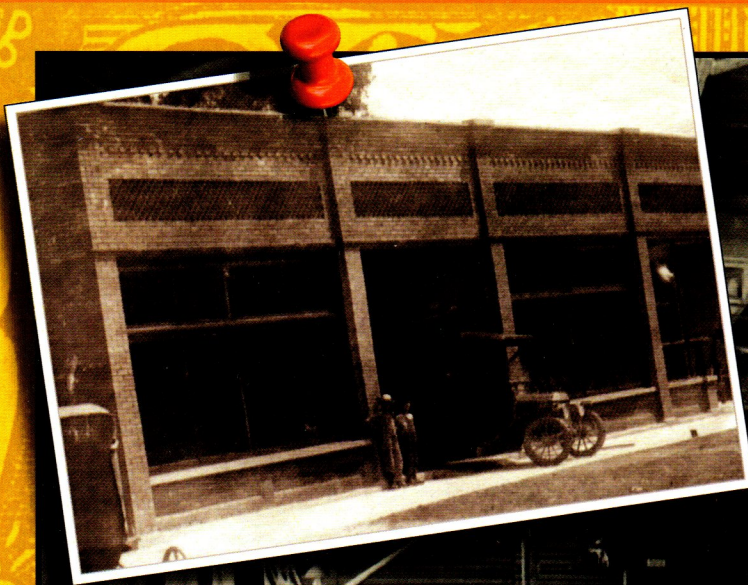

Club 21

Built in 1925 by Lou and Winnie Bowman after returning from Detroit where they helped build the Detroit Zoo. Originally a general store and gas station, the couple lived upstairs. The Bowman's ran the store through 1956 although he was legally blind from the late 1930's. Lou also built the home behind Club 21 after retiring. Lou Bowman died in 1967 at age 83 and was buried in Mt Pleasant Cemetery with Winnie, who had died in 1960 at the age of 74.

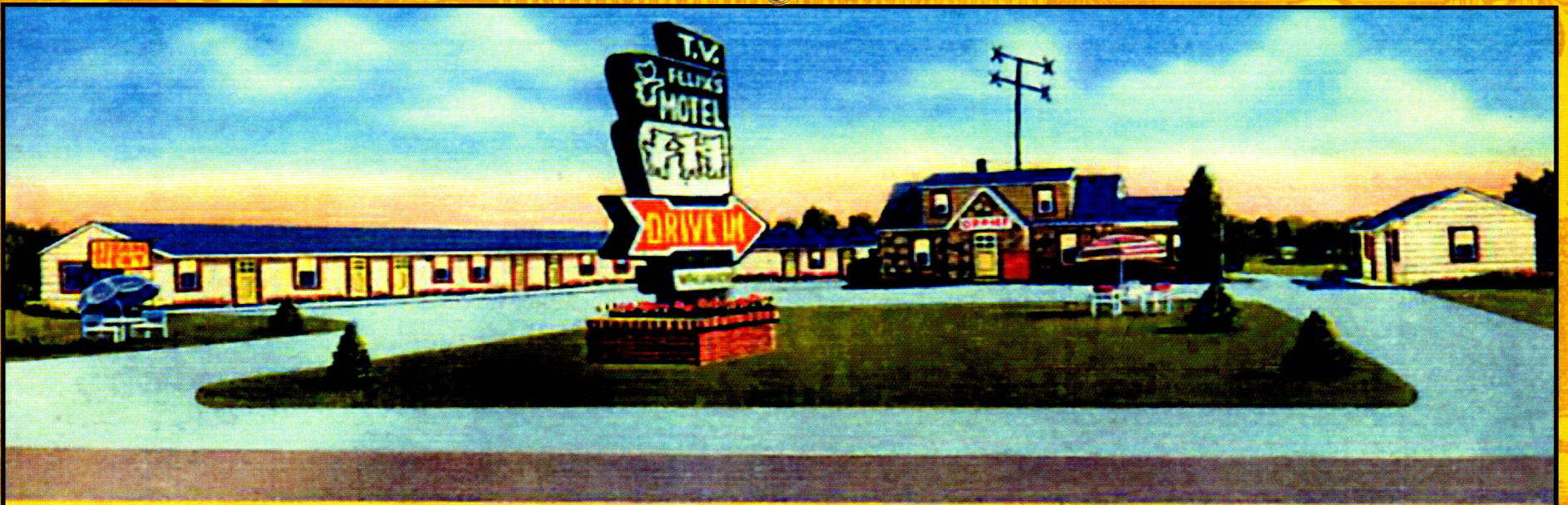

Built by Felix Rolin of Port Huron in late 40's. Wales Historical Society members Evelyn and Evan Edwards honeymooned at the Felix in 1955. In 1971, the motel and property were sold to Ernie and Joan Schroeder. In 1979, the Schroeders sold the motel to Ms Hudson, a teacher. In 1981, it was subsequently sold to a waitress at Club 21.

Campbell-Mudge-Webb Well Drilling

Located in Goodells, the business was owned by Pearl Campbell and wife Lillian during the 1920s (SCC directory 1928) Through family succession the company became Mudge and Webb Well drilling under Clyne Mudge and Otis Webb. Eventually, Mudge and Webb split along family lines and Webb well drilling continues today under owner George Webb. Clyne Mudge passed away in 2010 at age 95.

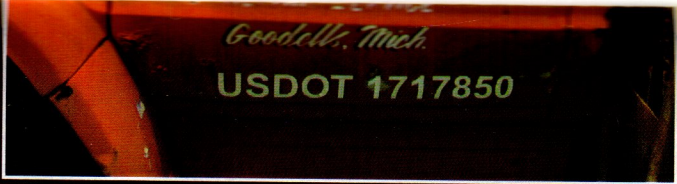

Raymond · Bradley Store

The Store was originally built on 40 acres owned by Daniel Reish. The 1928 SCC Directory indicates that the store was owned by James and Sarah Raymond and was a purveyor of "groceries, dry goods, gas, oil and tires". In 1984 Henry Bradley became the owner of the store, which was used in a film produced by Consumers Power to represent rural stores of the horse-drawn carriage era. The property is currently a private residence owned by David Defauw and rented to the John and Kristy Ardoin family.

Conrad Poultry - "The Chicken Hotel"

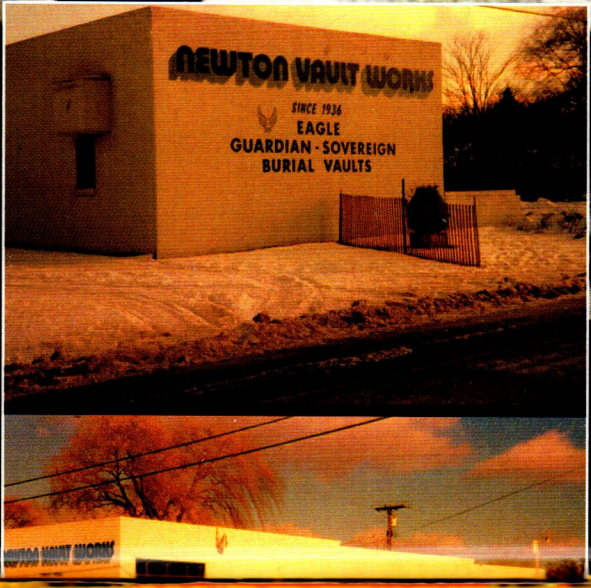
Robert Conrad founded Conrad's Poultry Farm in the mid 1940s, after graduating from Cornell University. He expanded his business at the corner of Lapeer and Echols Rds. The large four story "chicken hotel" operated 24 hours daily year round for egg production. Conrad's eggs were sold to the Park-Davis pharmaceutical company in Detroit for both medical experimentation and flu vaccine production. Mr. Conrad also raised cattle using skills passed on to him by his father, who was a local veterinarian.

Newton Burial Vaults

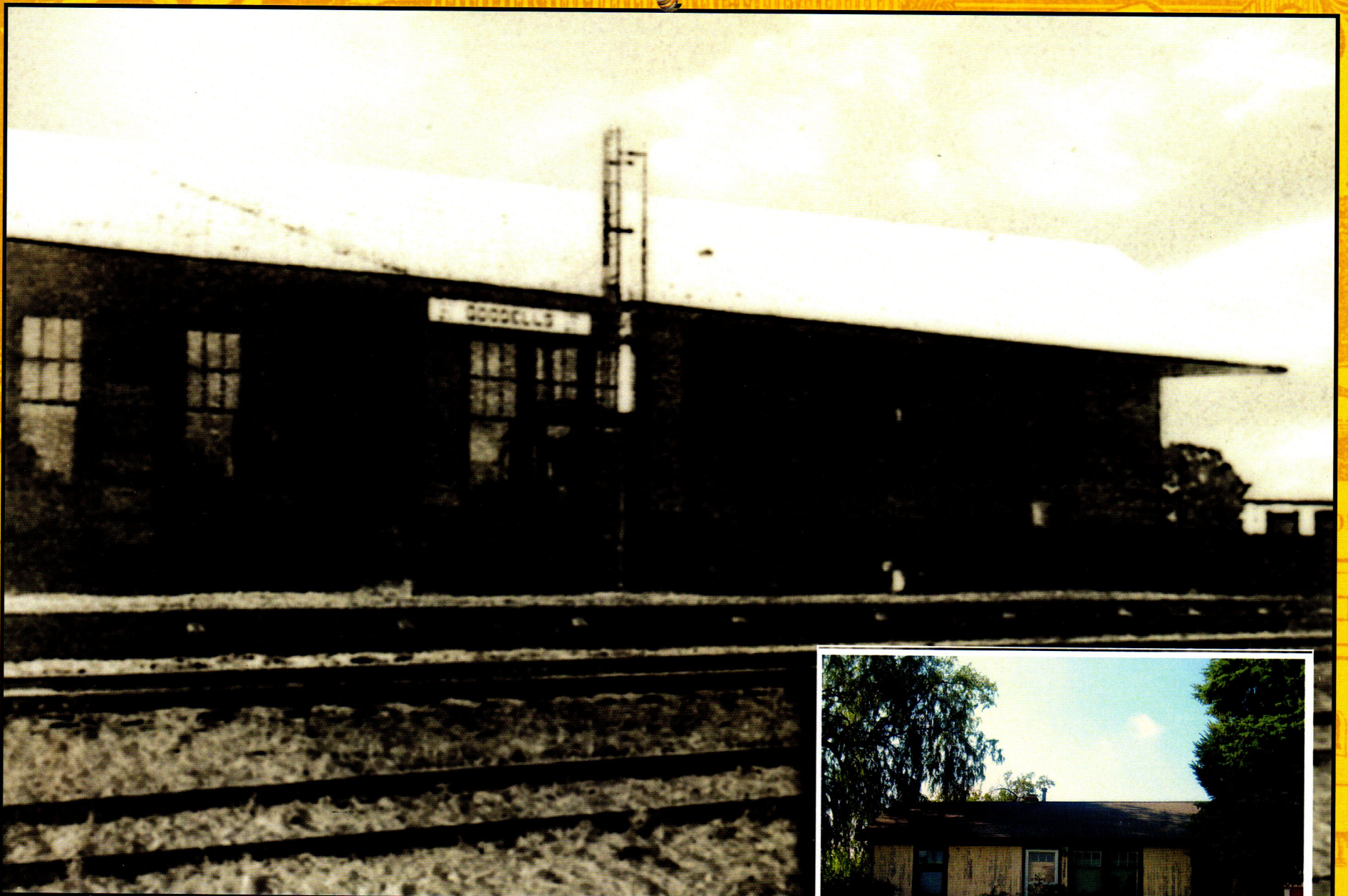
The business was started in 1938 in a garage on Lapeer Rd by Ardiel Newton Sr. After WWII Mr. Newton and his son moved the business to Goodells Rd in Goodells. The original building burned in the early 1950's but was immediately rebuilt. The business was sold to John Wagner in 1973 and operated until 1984 when it was closed.

Goodells Railroad Station

Built in 1866, the Goodells Railroad was established by Grand Trunk Railroad. The original building was replaced in 1917 (c) and subsequently disappeared. This second station remained in use until 1958, when it was closed and the building removed by Sylvester Bolday. The station was purchased for \$50 and stands on the corner of Quinn Rd. and Imlay City Rd. in Emmett Township.

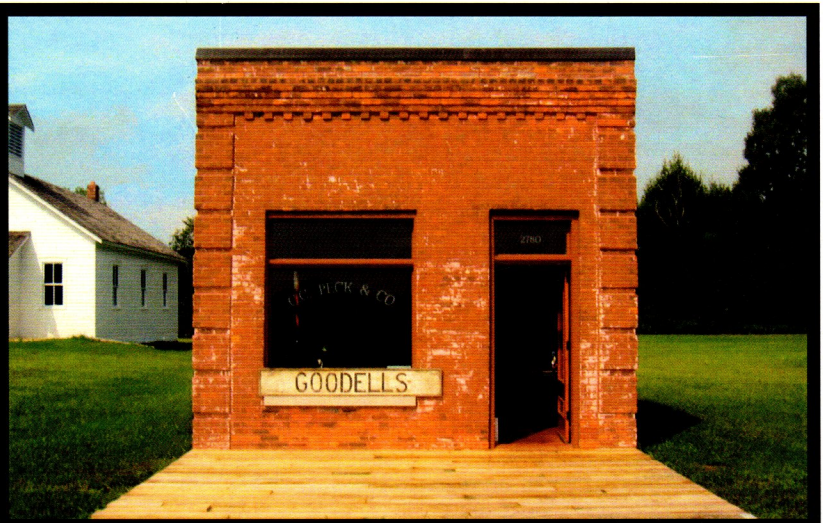
